Vincent L. DiCianni founded Affiliated Monitors, Inc. (AMI) in 2004 and has served as the company President since its inception. Over the course of its 20 years in existence, AMI has served in the independent monitor role in more than nine hundred matters under Mr. DiCianni's leadership, working with many federal regulatory agencies, including the DOJ, EPA, FTC, FCC, DOT, DOD, FHA, HHS and U.S. AID. The company also works with Attorneys General Offices across the country on matters involving healthcare licensure, Medicaid fraud, consumer protection, antitrust and other matters.

Mr. DiCianni started his legal career as an Assistant Attorney General for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under then Attorney General Frank Bellotti. He then went into private practice for twenty years, where he handled many matters before regulatory boards and agencies. In addition to his law practice, Mr. DiCianni served as an instructor in Ethics in the Criminal Justice Master's Program at Anna Maria College for thirteen years. The class grew out of and informed his interest in the development, analysis, and application of standards of conduct and codes of ethics, as well as his interest in the drivers of ethical behavior in individuals and organizations. Mr. DiCianni utilizes his knowledge and experience in the field of ethics to guide AMI and its clients.

Mr. DiCianni has integrated his interest in ethical behavior with his compliance-related work by developing a process to evaluate companies' corporate cultures, incentives, structures, policies, and controls. AMI's assessments provide organizations with an understanding of the effectiveness of their ethics and compliance programs and how they can be improved. In some engagements, AMI collaborates with companies to create or update their compliance programs and controls, train their board members or employees, or implement industry best-practices. The ethics and compliance services provided by AMI offer practical ways to incorporate both ethics and compliance into regular business operations. Compliance Program assessments are also a key requirement in Affiliated Monitors' monitoring engagements.

Mr. DiCianni has authored articles on various aspects of compliance and ethical culture of companies, including co-authoring a section of the <u>Society of Corporate Compliance and Ethics</u>' *The Complete Compliance and Ethics Manual* (CCEM) entitled "Corporate Probation: The Use of Independent Monitors to Improve Compliance and Prevent Fraud."
