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Val Peake has been a Compliance Solutions Manager for Affiliated Monitors, Inc. (AMI) since 2019. She is part of our Healthcare Team overseeing individual practitioners such as physicians, dentists, and veterinarians. She also supervises fiduciary assignments and individuals in sobriety maintenance programs. Recently Val also began helping AMI's Home Health team with record reviews.

Val is an experienced trainer, leader, and educator of health care regulatory issues. Prior to joining AMI, she worked as the Online Training Development Specialist for the Maryland Department of Human Services, Human Resources Development Team learning office. She developed online training modules and facilitated staff training sessions across the state.

Before arriving in Maryland, Val worked as a Training Coordinator and Medication Administration Program Coordinator for the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment, in the Health Facilities & Emergency Medical Services Division. During her fifteen-year tenure, Val received many awards, including Woman of the Year conferred by the National Association of Professional Women, and Program Partner of the Year conferred by Centers for Work Education and Employment.

Val developed knowledge and skills as a Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) State Training Coordinator; in this role, she facilitated learning through classroom instruction, virtual training, and on-the-job coaching. Val also partnered with stakeholders and subject matter experts to identify internal and external training programs to address competency gaps.

As Program Coordinator for Colorado's QMAP initiative, which teaches unlicensed staff members to safely administer medications in certain settings, Val coordinated and implemented program policies and strategies, developed curriculum, and led train-the-trainer courses. In addition, she conducted investigations into complaints from members of the public regarding Qualified Medication Administration Personnel. Under her supervision, the program grew from qualifying 2,500 medication administration personnel annually to over 6,000.

Since March 2009, Val has volunteered as the Victim Advocate at Colorado Moves Counseling, which provides outpatient therapy to men and women who are convicted of domestic abuse and/or drug/alcohol related events.

Val earned an MA in Accounting and a BA in Business Administration from Shaftsbury University, and certifications from Penn State in Project Management and from the National Organization of Victim Advocates (NOVA), specializing in Domestic Violence and Program Management.
